The purpose and benefits of ATV Maine

<u>To EDUCATE</u> its members and the general public regarding the safe and responsible use of All-Terrain Vehicles.

- Encourage affiliated clubs to participate in community events, organize trail rides, hold charity fundraisers, help in rescue efforts and promote a positive image within the community.
- Investigate new and innovative ways to get the message of safe and responsible ATV use out to the riders.
- Encourage all members to work with law enforcement and educate others on responsible behavior and how their actions affect our sport.

<u>To Be ONE VOICE</u> representing all ATV clubs when meeting with the State, Landowners, and other organizations.

- Act as a facilitator between ATV clubs, the State, and landowners to mediate any problems legally and fairly.
- Communicate to State agencies regarding the creation and maintenance of trail systems throughout the State.
- Participate and give presentations at public and governmental gatherings to positively promote the sport of ATV riding.

To SHARE INFORMATION between clubs, individuals, and the general public.

- Supporting Business members may be listed on our website and will receive a plaque for display and tag for each year of membership.
- Keep the media up to date on ATV issues and explain how these issues will affect ATV use and the economic impact it will have on the State.
- Make available ATV-related literature to any affiliated club and participate in area sports shows and events to positively promote the sport.

To Provide REPRESENTATION in Government, Local, State, and Federal.

- Be a unified voice in legislative issues regarding ATV use.
- Provide representation in policymaking decisions on ATV issues.
- Hold representative positions on government advisory committees.

To OPEN UP LANDS for more trails to ride on.

- Encourage affiliated clubs to help educate landowners, law enforcement & local government on the benefits of having a maintained ATV trail system.
- Work with corporate landowners, other state organizations, and the government to provide more land use opportunities to ATV clubs.

To Make INSURANCE available.

- Provide a \$3,500 Accidental Death and Dismemberment benefit to all ATV Maine primary members and their immediate families including supporting business owners.
- Offer General Liability Insurance to all affiliated clubs.

To TREAD LIGHTLY, to encourage the use of ATV's and establishment of ATV trails in a manner that will result in a minimum effect on the environment.

 Strongly stress the importance that clubs work with landowners and build trails that will stand up to repeated ATV use.

<u>Club Responsibility</u>. Each club maintains their trails to a standard the state has called Best Maintenance Standards to include.

- Brush cutting, trimming, mowing, raking, ditch work, and bridge work.
- Each club has events for fundraising from a simple BBQ to a ride event on the trails to raise money, IE Poker Run, this is not a competition. They sell their own merchandise.

<u>Safety Trailer:</u> ATV Maine has two safety trailers. Each trailer contains 2 machines for kids to learn and get comfortable riding.

- The course is covered by 2 to 6 adults so they can help keep an eye on the young riders.
- Each machine is governed by a speed limiter of no more than 10mph.
- Each machine has a kill switch that is remote operated by one of the adults.
- The course is closed and supervised with only those 2 machines having access.
- If the kill switch is used, it gives the young rider a chance to get off the machine or continue to ride.
- The course has all the trail signs for the young riders to see as well as simulated bridges for them to drive over.
